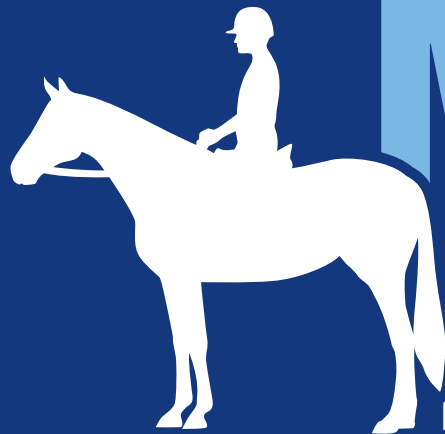

# GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

## CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Every class offered herein which is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted in accordance therewith.

### MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

In all classes wherein the rules of USEF do not apply, Management shall settle any dispute or question that may arise and its decision shall be final. Exhibitors and other participants herein, as a condition to admission, consent to such method of settlement. MANAGEMENT reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally and to cancel any entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel awards of prizes, without claim for damages. MANAGEMENT reserves the right to reschedule, combine, close, delete, or add any classes or change the listed officials as may be necessary and in the best interests of the show. Neither the show committee/staff, the show, SOUTH FLORIDA HUNTER AND JUMPER ASSOCIATION INC., STALL WATCH, PALM BEACH INTERNATIONAL EQUESTRIAN CENTER, the show manager, the show sponsors, any show officials, nor any sanctioning body will be responsible for any accident, damage, loss or injury to mount, owner, rider or other persons or property.

### ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulting or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time,

terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org), as amended from time to time, as well as all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If I am signing and submitting this Agreement electronically, I acknowledge that my electronic signature shall have the same validity, force and effect as if I affixed my signature by my own hand.

### ENTRY PROCEDURE

1. ALL FEES MUST BE PAID IN U.S. FUNDS.
2. The following fees must accompany the entry form for each show entered: All stall and or non-stabling fees. Entries not accompanied by the fees shown above will be considered POST.
3. All Entries must be submitted digitally at [sfhja.showgroundslive.com](http://sfhja.showgroundslive.com). Entries submitted after the closing date (May 10th) will be POST and must be accompanied by a \$30 post entry fee
4. A Credit Card must be used to submit entry digitally at [sfhja.showgroundslive.com](http://sfhja.showgroundslive.com). Checks (in US Funds) can be using to close entries at the end of the show.
5. Back numbers will not be given out without a SIGNED OPEN CHECK OR CREDIT CARD.
6. Numbers will not be given out until entry blanks are signed.
7. A number will be assigned each horse and will stand for the entire show. Horses with multiple riders will only be issued one number.
8. Entries with incorrect or no numbers may be excused from the ring. All entries must have the show issued number on at all times when outside of their stall.
9. All accounts must be settled after each show. Open Checks and credit cards will be filled in or charged 24 hours after the show.

### PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted or a check will be mailed to the owner at the address on the entry blank within thirty days, if a Social Security Number or Tax ID is on file, after the show, thereby ending the show's responsibility. Any class that has a number of entries required, will have the payout based on the number of on time entries and post entries will not be included in the number used to determine the payout. Classes that do not have enough entries to pay out prize money will either be cancelled, or run without prize money at the exhibitors option. Any class with less than 4 entries will not pay prize money and entry fee will be as listed. A Social Security number or Tax ID must be on file to receive prize money.

### BACK NUMBERS

You MUST wear the back number provided by the show. European bridle or breastplate numbers will not be accepted as the only form of a number. If you fail to have your show issued number on your back or pinned to your saddle pad in plain view you may be eliminated from your class. Any participant using our online entry system, still needs to come to the show office and sign their entry blank and obtain a show issued number. **All horses in the schooling area or warm-up area must have its show number attached to the horse or the individual riding or handling. Any horse without its correct number will be asked to leave the area. (HJ106)**

### CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

Management will not refund entry fees if classes are cancelled due to severe weather, an emergency or some other act of god. If the entire show is cancelled due to severe weather or an emergency, management will refund those class fees.

# GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

## EQUINE ZERO LIABILITY

FLORIDA SENATE BILL 1658 EQUINE ZERO LIABILITY STATUTE: Warning-Under Florida Law an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities.

## SCHOOLING

Ample schooling fences will be provided in designated schooling areas. Schooling areas are all-weather footing. There will be organized schooling on May 17th from 9AM-12:30PM in the Hunter Ring 1 and 9AM-4PM in the Jumper Rings & Hunter 2. There will be NO schooling on May 16th. Other schooling times may be designated by management. You must have a signed SFHJA Entry Blank in the show office and a SFHJA back number. Back numbers must be worn while schooling. Each horse entered in the horse show will be charged a flat rate of \$50 for schooling. This fee will be charged regardless of whether you school or not, exceptions will be made to leadline & walk/trot.

## BILLING DISPUTES

Any open invoices will be closed by office staff at the end of the show with the method of payment holding the entry. It is the exhibitors responsibility to review their bill and resolve any discrepancies within one hour of the show ending. If disputes are not negotiated within this time frame the bill will stand as is without any further review.

## OFFICE FEES

There will be a \$40 office fee added to each entry. Entries received in the show office by the closing date will be considered on time. There will be no extra fees for adding or scratching classes.

## NON-NEGOTIABLE FUNDS

Any non negotiable funds or disputed credit cards will be charged a \$100 process fee per occurrence plus up to 1.5% interest/month.

## DRUGS AND MEDICATIONS / FEDERATION FEES

GR208.1 Competition Fees. [Chapter 2. Membership Classifications 1. For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$23 Federation fee will be collected (\$15 shall be an Equine Drugs and Medication fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1, .2 and .3). Exception: Horses entered in classes exempted from the Equine Drugs and Medication fee are also exempt from the balance of the Federation fee. A \$7.00 USHJA Fee per horse entered at National & Jumper 4\* And Higher Shows, and \$2.00 at Regional Shows

## GROUNDS FEE

All NON-STABLING entries will be charged a grounds fee of \$50. This charge will be automatic to any horse or pony that is not paying a stall fee to the show. Exception will be allowed for any Leadline Entry.

## STALLS

Stall reservations and payments are due no later than one week prior to show. Stalls are \$150 for the Friday thru Sunday. If stabling with others during this time period, you will be charged a \$50 grounds fee. Stalls will be at 8am on May 17th. Stalls are permanent with doors and matted floors, and will be assigned as entries accompanied by stall fees are received on a first come, first serve basis. Stalls are limited and fees must accompany entry to insure reservations. First bedding is not included. Bedding will be available on thru Gold Coast Feed (561-793-4607). All trash is to be placed in the receptacles provided, not in the manure bins. All manure is to be put in the area provided. All horses in stalls will be charged \$15 flat fee for Night Watch.

## PROTEST

Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$200.00 for USEF Members or \$300 for Non-Members with the Show Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the show if the same is not sustained. All protests must be addressed to the Show Secretary, made in writing, signed by the protester, and filed with the Show Secretary or Show Manager within 48 hours. Protests may also be files with the Federation Hearing Committee as outlined in GR603.1.

## HUNTER & EQUITATION ATTIRE

Proper riding attire is required: boots, breeches, riding jacket, shirt with choker or tie. Riders must wear coats in all classes unless otherwise announced. It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured GR801. **PLEASE MAKE YOURSELF AWARE OF ALL JUMPER ATTIRE RULES PRINTED IN THIS PRIZE LIST.**

## SHOW PASS FEES & HORSE REGISTRATION \*\*IMPORTANT NEW INFORMATION\*\*

For those exhibitors who are not current members of the USHJA a \$30 Show Pass will be added to your entry. For USEF Riders & Owners will only be allowed ONE USEF Show Pass per calendar year. The show pass must be paid from your USEF account on your member dashboard. You must login to your account to apply for the show pass. Anyone listed as trainer or coach (including Parents) must be active USEF members. This cannot be done in the show office. In addition each horse regardless of whether the owner is a current member of the USEF or USHJA must pay a \$75 lifetime horse registration fee to the USHJA (Annual Outreach memberships do not count as an active membership). Forms will be available in the office to renew USHJA memberships. You can go to [www.ushja.org](http://www.ushja.org) for more information. Those exempt from these fees are listed in GR901.9 1-9. (Exception: USEF Opportunity and Academy Classes) USEF 206.1

## AIR VESTS

Air vest are allowed (and encouraged) in all disciplines. For Hunter and Equitation Classes Judges are instructed not to deduct points for the use of air vests worn over coats. Please note that the show will not be delayed in order to reset air vests. Riders who choose to wear air vests are therefore strongly encouraged to have spare equipment (air canisters, tethers and entire vests) so that vest that have been inflated can quickly be returned to their operation. Please look for air canister recycling containers located at participating Air Vest vendors.

## JUMP ORDER

In all classes over fences management MAY designate the order of go. All orders will be posted by each ring 30 minutes before the class and the one minute rule will be in effect. Riders that foresee conflicts must communicate with the paddock masters involved - don't rely on radio contact only! Riders are forewarned that the show will not be held up because of trainer conflicts. After order of go in any class is posted there will be no refunds allowed. Jumper classes with a posted order of go will use the following procedure in accordance with JP112.2: the horses names are drawn individually, starting from the first position and then working down.

## POLING

We do not allow any sort of manual poling or poling of any type on the competitions show grounds.



# GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

## MEDICAL WASTE & SHARPS

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Biohazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. Sharps will be placed in sharp containers provided. Anyone found discarding sharps in any other manner will be fined up to \$100 per instance and held responsible for any fines or expenses incurred by management. Violations to this rule will be dealt with very seriously. Improper disposal of sharps poses a serious health threat to anyone who may come in contact with it. Please make sure that anyone who handles these sharps on your behalf are aware of the responsibility involved. Neither ignorance or language will excuse fine enforcement. If you need additional containers or any assistance with the disposal of sharps, please ask the office or a member of the staff.

## DOGS

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. GR1301.6. Any dog that is found loose will be detained by the show until a fine is paid. Any dog that disrupts an exhibitor's round will be required to pay the exhibitor for that round plus a \$100 fine to the show. Also please dispose of all dog waste in the proper containers.

## FEED & BEDDING

Feed & Bedding will be available by the official vendor - Gold Coast Feed (561-793-4607). No other feed or bedding vendor will be permitted on the show grounds due to insurance & liability requirements of master lease, without the express permission of management. Exhibitors wishing to use another vendor do so at their own risk and must receive permission for that vendor to come on the grounds. Proof of insurance and licenses will be required before permission is granted. Permit fees will apply. No outside deliveries will be allowed between 8:00 AM- 6:00 PM. Storage of feed, bedding, hay, etc. must be within the stall space only. No straw will be allowed without a charge for its separate removal and waste storage.

## COMBINING & SPLITTING SECTIONS

Sections that are scheduled as split sections will be combined following current USEF rules. All USEF Federation rules for combining Rated sections will be in affect. If you are interested in sponsorship contact show management the day before the section is started to avoid last minute changes. The show will be in compliance of HU 116 and HU 112-118. Please note classes will not be re-divided after close of entries at 4 p.m. the day before the section starts. Any entry and accepted after the closing time will not be calculated in the minimums for splitting.

## CHAMPION AND RESERVE

Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in all Hunter Sections. The awards will be made to two of the four horses that have acquired the most points in the over fences classes. In addition to these points, only those four horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in the Under Saddle Class. Points will be awarded on the basis of 10,6,4,2,1,1/2 for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th places respectively. All classes are full point classes. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in all Jumper sections on the basis of points in accordance with JP110.2.a Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in the Equitation Sections in accordance with EQ112.15.a with the top two riders with the most points being eligible.

## GOLF CARTS, SCOOTERS & OTHER VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

NO APPLIANCES OF ANY KIND MAY BE PLUGGED INTO FACILITY OUTLETS BY ORDER OF FIRE MARSHALL.

## FOUND ON JUDGES CARD

Horses competing in classes that they have not been entered in the office on the official add/drop form (there is no adding at the gate) all adds that come off that will be required to pay \$30 per class.

## SAFE SPORT

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. # IMPORTANT EQUINE HEALTH INFORMATION

South Florida Hunter Jumper Association and Equestrian Sport Productions has had vaccination protocol in place since 2013. South Florida Hunter Jumper Association will follow any protocols in place by Equestrian Sport Productions. We will now adhere to GR845 in which:

At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

5. A current negative coggins test. Please renew before it expires, and not just before it is necessary to leave the state. It is strongly recommended that all horses be vaccinated for Equine EHV-1 (either modified live or killed vaccine) no sooner than 7 days prior and no later than 180 days prior to entering the show grounds. Most EHV-1 vaccines are only considered effective for 180 days. Check with your veterinarian about which vaccine you use.

6. Once the horse leaves the facility you may be required to show a new Statement Of Health upon your return to the facility. Current vaccination against WNV, EEE, WEE, Tetanus and Rabies is strongly recommended

7. You should be able to document your horses normal temperature before arrival. Please do not ship horses with elevated temperatures. It is recommended that you establish a log of temperatures taken at least twice daily. If there is an elevated temperature for more than a 24 hour period, please consult your local Veterinarian immediately.

8. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses shipped long distances. Extra hours on a horse van, or moving from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horses' and your neighbors horses' health.

9. Any horse on the show grounds with a fever of unknown origin or of suspicious origin must be reported to SFHJA Management. It is always better to err on the side of safety. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.

10. Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices and impress its importance to your groom in everyday care

11. Vesicular Stomatitis - Per USEF SFHJA Acknowledgement of Vesicular Stomatitis Option A - Restrict entries from USDA confirmed VS- Affected Counties under the condition that notification is made to the Federation and all potential participants no less than five (5) days prior to the start of competition and the notification is published on an obvious location on the competition social media sites. Note: This option applies if no horses from VS Affected Counties are entered in your event and none are expected to attend your event. This is on a Show by Show Basis, management may change the requirements in the future..

Hunt and Go Format

**\*Please note this Hunt and Go is judged differently than the International Hunter Derby Hunt and Go.**

Alternatively, the Hunt and Go option may be utilized in lieu of the traditional format. The Hunt and Go format will consist of two (2) phases, one (1) Classic Hunter and one (1) Handy Hunter. The phases will be jumped consecutively. All participants will complete both the Classic and the Handy portions even if penalties (rails, refusals, etc.) are incurred. Major penalties (falls, 3 refusals, off course, etc.) will result in elimination.

1. Standard Hunt and Go Format

a. The Classic Hunter Round, consisting of seven to eight (7-8) fences with two (2) high options, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going.

b. After the completion of the classic round horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin their handy portion of the class. Riders are not permitted to walk or pause between rounds. The Handy Hunter Round, consisting of five to eight (5-8) fences with two (2) high options, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. A horse/ rider may not jump decorations or other obstacles in order to create a shorter track.

c. Two (2) judges are required to judge the class. Each judge will be designated either the Classic Hunter Phase or the Handy Hunter Phase. Each will provide a single score for their

designated phase, in addition to the Bonus points of one point per high option jump that will be added to each judging's score. The scores from each judge will be added together to determine the total score and placement.

d. A judging assistant may be present during all phases of the competition. The duties of the judging assistant include notifying the Judges if a rail comes down and when a horse jumps the higher height option fences. The judging assistant is not required to be a licensed official and is not responsible for the scoring of the judging panels. A competition staff member may fill this role.

e. The Option Bonus Score of one (1) additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse- and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence.

f. For the Hunt and Go Format it is recommended that the judge designated to the Classic Hunter phase be the tie breaker.

A minimum of twelve (12) entries, including horses tied for 12th place, must return for Round Two, if available.

Horses will not be required to jog for soundness.

Attire: Formal dress attire is suggested but not required: Buff breeches and Shad belly. White breeches and dark or scarlet coat, hunt colors, or official sponsor or team jacket permitted.

**Participation in these classes accrues double points for the USHJA Zone Horse of the Year standings double points for USEF National Horse of the Year standings.**

**CLASS SPECIFICATIONS:** All challenges will be held as a one round Handy Hunter class. Management will offer the Handy Hunter Challenge as a standalone class. If held as a stand-alone class, the course must have a minimum of ten (10) fences set at appropriate heights and spreads.

**Fence Heights:** Children's & Adult to be set at 3'. Small/Medium Children's Hunter Ponies to be set at 2' & Large Children's Hunter Pony to be set at 2'6".

A) In the 3' Children's & Adult Handy Hunter Challenge, management will offer up to three (3) high option fences set three inches (3") higher with spreads not to exceed the fence height. The course should be designed as an introduction to Handy courses, and it is encouraged that the course includes at least one (1) in-and-out, a bending line, rollback, and a trot fence. The use of natural obstacles, ditches and banks are encouraged.

B) In the Children's Pony Handy Hunter Challenge, there will be no high options. The course should be designed as an introduction to Handy courses, and it is encouraged that the course includes a bending line, a roll back turn, and a trot fence. The use of natural obstacles, ditches and banks is encouraged.

**ELIGIBILITY:** The rider and the owner (or recorded lessee) of the horse/pony must have USHJA Zone 4 as their home zone of record to participate and are eligible to compete under Zone 4 Specifications. The rider and owner must be Active members, in good standing, of both USEF and USHJA before the start of the challenges. Horses/Children's Hunter Ponies must be registered with USHJA and USEF in order to participate.

**RESTRICTIONS:** Riders may only compete on one horse/pony per Handy Hunter Challenge, but may ride in multiple Handy Hunter Challenges at the same competition. Horses and Children's Hunter Pony may only compete in one Handy Hunter Challenges per competition. Professionals are not eligible to compete in the Handy Hunter Challenges.

**JUDGING:** The Handy Hunter Challenges shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, handiness, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. In addition to the base score, a Handy Bonus Score consisting of zero (0) to ten (10) bonus points to each horse-and-rider combination for handiness of round must be given. If high option fences are included in the course, an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped without knock down will also be added. The two or three scores and the sum total must be announced separately. The judge or judging panel may not award the same base score to any two competitors in the class unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. All ties will be broken by the base score of the judge or judging panel before adding height and/or handy bonus points.

# JUMPER ATTIRE

This will be enforced so please make sure you are dressed according to what class you are entered in. Please be advised Exposed Hoodies of any kind are prohibited.

## Proper Jumper Attire

Coats of any color are required. Breeches must be a light color (white, fawn or canary). Pastel and dark colored breeches are not allowed. Shirts, light in color, must be tucked in and fastened at the top of the neck. Ties or chokers of any color must be worn (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use). Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

All other classes will require Standard attire.

Classes requiring Proper attire are any Classic or Stakes class.

## Standard Jumper Attire

Coats are not required. Breeches of any color are permitted. Shirts (polo shirts are permitted) must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short), and must be tucked into the breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

All other classes will require Standard attire.

In extreme weather conditions the use of jackets, sweaters or raincoats, without exposed hoods can be allowed by management and/or permission from the jumper jury. Permission must be granted before entering the competition ring.

## Air Vests

Air vests are allowed (and encouraged) in all disciplines. For Hunter and Equitation Classes, Judges are instructed not to deduct points for the use of air vest worn over coats. Please note that the show will not be delayed in order to reset air vests. Riders who choose to wear air vests are therefore strongly encouraged to have spare equipment (air canisters, tethers and entire vests) so that vest that have been inflated can quickly be returned to their operation. Please look for air canister recycling containers located at participating Air Vest vendors.

## Safety Vests

Safety vests are permitted without a show coat ONLY if being worn with a color matched long sleeved collared shirt. example: A black long sleeved collared shirt may be worn with a black safety vest

In cases where the above requirements are not followed the penalty will be either a possible warning (for the first offense) or elimination. Please note that competitors are responsible for their own clothing. A wardrobe malfunction (e.g., magnets, zippers, buttons breaking) is not an excuse for improper attire.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

### WARNING:

**Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.**

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.
